Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.



Acts 8:26-40

Session Summary

For a time, the Lord allowed Saul to live arrogantly, approving of the stoning of Stephen (who was the first Christian martyr), and to wreak havoc upon the church through violence. Jesus' appearance to Saul may seem sudden to us, but this encounter was long known and arranged by God Himself. According to God's perfect plan, Jesus called Saul to believe in and obey the resurrected Savior.

Conversation Questions

- What was it look like for us to encounter Jesus for the first time?
- How does knowing Jesus change everything about how we live?
- Why should we be encouraged to know God can use someone like Saul?
- Who is someone we know that has been radically changed by Jesus?

Family Challenge

We don't need a powerful testimony like Paul to serve God faithfully. In fact, every testimony is powerful when we think how God took us from death to life. Give each person a piece of paper to write down their salvation story. Feel free to share your stories with each other, then encourage each family member to find someone outside your immediate family to share their story with this week.
